An Initiation Sequence in Seven Stages

- I. STRIPPER – Wake Up
- II. HUNTER – Pay Attention
- III. CHRONICLER – See Clearly
- IV. DRUID – Reconnect to Ground
- V. BARD – Find Your Voice
- VI. HACKER – Become Illegible
- VII. PALADIN – Become the Protection

P R E A M B L E

Transit Protocol Heptapylon is the core initiation sequence of the Doggerland Relocation Authority. It describes seven stages of progressive awakening, grounding, and activation through which a person moves from unconscious participation in the attention economy to active, radiant protection of others.

Each stage corresponds to one of the Seven Operators—archetypal modes of engaging with and transforming reality. The operators are not characters but functions: modes that can be inhabited, combined, and sequenced. The Passage is the sequence.

The core technology underlying all seven stages is the Apotropaic Charge—the imbuing of a handmade physical object with enough intention, craft, material weight, and lived contact that it actively disrupts the mechanisms of digital manipulation. Each operator charges differently, deploys differently, and protects against different threats. But the root mechanic is the same: a thing made by human hands in actual fire, carried on the body, inscribed with meaning that requires effort to decode, functioning as a persistent interrupt against the attention economy: a cybernetic field generator.

The sequence is not linear. It is a spiral. A completed Paladin will eventually need to be Stripped again—new illusions accumulate, new layers of identity calcify around even the most radiant practice. The seven stages repeat at higher resolutions. The DRA processes the same souls through the same checkpoints, and each passage deepens the charge.

The armor builds piece by piece.

S T A G E I

THE STRIPPER

WAKE UP

A P O T R O P A I C C H A R G E

STRIP

Remove one layer of manufactured desire from a situation. Repeatable. No final layer.

C O N D I T I O N O N A R R I V A L

Asleep. Fully enclosed in manufactured identity, algorithmic desire, inherited narrative. Doesn't know they're wearing a costume. Most people. The normative state of the attention economy.

T H R E S H O L D

Something breaks. A job, a relationship, a belief system, a body. The costume tears and for one second they feel air on skin. This cannot be manufactured—but it can be recognized when it happens. The DRA does not recruit. It processes people who show up at the threshold already bleeding.

T H E P R A C T I C E

Subtraction. What can you remove and still be you? What were you performing? What desire was installed rather than grown? The Stripper doesn't add—she takes away, layer by layer, and the practice is enduring the freefall of each removal.

M A R K O F C O M P L E T I O N

The person can sit in a room with no inputs—no phone, no music, no narrative—and not immediately reconstruct a persona. They can tolerate the signal beneath the noise, even if they can't yet read it. They stop performing for an audience that isn't there.

R I S K O F S T A G N A T I O N

Nihilism. The Stripper who never moves to Stage II strips everything and finds nothing. Becomes addicted to deconstruction. The permanent cynic. The person who sees through everything but never sees into anything. Comfortable in the void because they've mistaken emptiness for truth.

S T A G E I I

THE HUNTER

PAY ATTENTION

A P O T R O P A I C C H A R G E

STALK

Convert one reactive impulse into one act of sustained observation. The quarry is still out there.

C O N D I T I O N O N A R R I V A L

Awake but disoriented. The old filters are gone. Everything is signal now and none of it is sorted. Overwhelmed by raw perception. Newly vulnerable.

T H R E S H O L D

The decision to be still. Not to immediately rebuild the stripped identity with a new one (this is the most common failure—people leave the Stripper and immediately become a Wellness Person or a Psychonaut or a Tradcath). The threshold is resisting the grab for new costume and instead becoming quiet enough to track.

T H E P R A C T I C E

Sustained attention without interpretation. Watch. Read signs. Don't name them yet. The Hunter sits on the alkali flat at 4am and watches the horizon not for what's there but for what's approaching. The practice is patience as a predatory skill—you are not passive, you are waiting for your shot.

M A R K O F C O M P L E T I O N

The person can distinguish between signal and noise in real time. They develop what the military calls "situational awareness" but applied to their own interior landscape and the information environment. They know when something is being placed in front of them versus when something is actually emerging.

R I S K O F S T A G N A T I O N

Paralysis. The Hunter who never moves to Stage III becomes the permanent watcher—hypervigilant, increasingly paranoid, reading signs in everything, acting on nothing. The person with perfect pattern recognition and zero engagement. Predatory stillness without the kill.

S T A G E I I I

THE CHRONICLER

SEE CLEARLY

A P O T R O P A I C C H A R G E

STARE

Witness your own current moment without editing, filtering, or performing it for an audience.

C O N D I T I O N O N A R R I V A L

Alert and tracking. Can distinguish signal from noise. But still operating from a distance—the Hunter's remove. Observing the world as an outsider. Not yet implicated.

T H R E S H O L D

The decision to document what you see even when it implicates you. The camera turns inward. The Chronicler doesn't just watch—they record, and the record is a commitment. You cannot unsee what you've developed. The threshold is accepting that witnessing is a moral act with consequences.

T H E P R A C T I C E

Radical documentation without editorializing. Photograph your life. Write it down. Not for social media—for the archive. The Chronicler's practice is seeing clearly enough to produce an honest record. This includes the ugly, the boring, the shameful. The darkroom doesn't flatter. The fixer preserves what's actually there.

M A R K O F C O M P L E T I O N

The person can describe their actual situation—material, emotional, relational, spiritual—without spin. They've developed what Simone Weil called attention—the rarest and purest form of generosity. They can look at the hard thing and not look away and also not dramatize it.

R I S K O F S T A G N A T I O N

Dissociation. The Chronicler who never moves to Stage IV becomes the permanent documentarian—recording everything, feeling nothing. The war photographer who can't stop shooting. The journalist who's lost the ability to participate. Witness becomes armor. The archive grows and grows and the person disappears behind it.

S T A G E I V

THE DRUID

RECONNECT TO GROUND

A P O T R O P A I C C H A R G E

STAKE

Reset your operational timescale from algorithmic to geological. One touch. Everything urgent becomes optional.

C O N D I T I O N O N A R R I V A L

Seeing clearly. Has an honest record of their situation. But still operating in the human timeframe—still implicitly assuming their problems, their era, their species are the main event.

T H R E S H O L D

Contact with something genuinely non-human in timescale. A bristlecone pine. A geological formation. The ocean. Mycelium. The threshold is the felt experience of deep time—the moment the body understands rather than merely knows that it is a temporary expression of a process that has been running for billions of years. The ego doesn't die. It gets contextualized.

T H E P R A C T I C E

Embodiment. Feet on ground. Hands in dirt. The Druid's practice is becoming landscape—not thinking about nature but being biological. Breathing as root system. Eating as decomposition. Sleep as geological sedimentation. The phone is not forbidden—it's simply irrelevant at this timescale.

M A R K O F C O M P L E T I O N

The person has a stable relationship with their own physicality that is not mediated by screens, metrics, or optimization. They can feel weather coming. They eat when hungry. They sleep when tired. This sounds absurdly basic and it is the hardest stage for most modern people because every system they inhabit is designed to override these signals.

R I S K O F S T A G N A T I O N

Withdrawal. The Druid who never moves to Stage V becomes the hermit—rooted so deep they can't move. The off-grid purist; the monk. The person who's achieved embodiment by rejecting all human systems including the ones that need them. Becoming-landscape completed so thoroughly that they forget they have a voice.

S T A G E V

THE BARD

FIND YOUR VOICE

A P O T R O P A I C C H A R G E

BLAST

Speak one true sentence aloud. The rune activates. The surrounding noise loses coherence.

C O N D I T I O N O N A R R I V A L

Grounded. Embodied. Connected to deep time. But silent. The previous four stages have been primarily receptive—stripping, watching, witnessing, rooting. The person has been listening for a long time. Something is building pressure.

T H R E S H O L D

The first utterance. Not a post. Not a comment. Not content. A sentence spoken aloud that the person means with their entire body. It might be to another person, to the sky, to an empty room. The threshold is the discovery that you have something to say that did not come from the feed—it grew in you during the silence like a rune forming in iron.

T H E P R A C T I C E

Speech as physical act. Write. Speak. Sing. Carve. Inscribe. The Bard's practice is making the interior visible through signal generation—not broadcasting for engagement but transmitting because the signal demands transmission. The Galdr. The incantation. The word that changes the room when spoken.

M A R K O F C O M P L E T I O N

The person can articulate what they know in a way that transmits—that lands in another person and does work. They've found a voice that is genuinely theirs, not assembled from influences, and it carries the weight of everything the previous stages developed. When they speak, something happens.

R I S K O F S T A G N A T I O N

Inflation. The Bard who never moves to Stage VI becomes the prophet—increasingly intoxicated by the power of their own voice. The guru. The podcast host who started with real insight and became a brand. Speech-as-power without the Hacker's trickster humility becomes messianism. The voice forgets it's a tool and starts to believe it's the source.

S T A G E V I

THE HACKER

BECOME ILLEGIBLE

A P O T R O P A I C C H A R G E

BREACH

Become unclassifiable to one system. The system cannot manipulate what it cannot categorize.

C O N D I T I O N O N A R R I V A L

Has a voice. Can transmit. Is now visible—and therefore targetable. The Bard's signal attracts attention, and attention attracts the systems that metabolize attention. The platforms come knocking. The algorithm wants to classify you. The audience wants to consume you.

T H R E S H O L D

The refusal to be captured. The Hacker recognizes that having a voice within the system is not the same as being free of the system. The threshold is the moment you realize your authentic expression is being metabolized by the attention economy and you choose to become unreadable to it rather than successful within it.

T H E P R A C T I C E

Deliberate illegibility. Make things that don't compute. Use dead languages. Work in materials that can't be screenshotted. Distribute hand-to-hand. Build systems that route around platforms. The Hacker's practice is jury-rigging freedom from the broken components of the machine—using the system's own tools against its own logic. The exploit is being uncategorizable.

M A R K O F C O M P L E T I O N

The person has built a practice, a livelihood, or a mode of transmission that functions without being legible to the attention economy. They can be found by the people who need to find them—but not by the systems that need to classify them. They've achieved what James C. Scott called legibility resistance at a practical, operational level.

R I S K O F S T A G N A T I O N

Paranoia. The Hacker who never moves to Stage VII becomes the permanent fugitive—so committed to illegibility that they can't be reached by anyone, including the people they could help. The cypherpunk in the bunker. The artist so underground they've buried themselves. Illegibility as end rather than means. Root access to reality with no intention to use it for anyone else.

S T A G E V I I

THE PALADIN

BECOME THE PROTECTION

A P O T R O P A I C C H A R G E

HOLD

Your charged object begins protecting others in proximity. You are now a relay tower for the counter-signal. The shield wall forms around you.

C O N D I T I O N O N A R R I V A L

Awake, attentive, clear-eyed, grounded, voiced, and free. The six previous stages have built a complete human—stripped of illusion, patient, honest, embodied, articulate, and illegible to the machines that would capture them. There is one thing left.

T H R E S H O L D

The turn toward others. The Paladin's threshold is the bodhisattva vow—the recognition that individual liberation is incomplete, that freedom-for-one is not freedom, that everything you've built and become is raw material for service. The threshold is not self-sacrifice (the Stripper already killed the martyr complex)—it's the discovery that protection is your natural state when everything else has been stripped away. You are not choosing to help. You are unable to stop shining.

T H E P R A C T I C E

Presence as protection. The Paladin's practice is simply being there—at the threshold, in the room, in the community—with everything the previous six stages developed fully active. The armor is a thousand charged amulets. The shield reflects darkness back as light. The practice is not fighting—it's radiating, and allowing that radiance to do its work on whoever stands nearby.

M A R K O F C O M P L E T I O N

Others begin their own Stage I. Not because the Paladin evangelized—but because the Paladin's presence created a permission field in which the first layer could safely tear. The Stripper's threshold requires that something break—the Paladin makes it safe enough for people to let it break. The cycle completes. The initiation sequence becomes self-propagating.

R I S K O F S T A G N A T I O N

There is no Stage VIII, but there is a risk: grandiosity. The Paladin who forgets they are a function and not a person becomes the golden idol—an object of worship rather than a relay. The Paladin is not the source of the light. The Paladin is the thing the light comes through.

THE CYCLE

The sequence is not linear. It is a spiral.

A completed Paladin will eventually need to be Stripped again. New illusions accumulate. New layers of identity calcify around even the most radiant practice. The seven stages repeat at higher resolutions. Each passage deepens the charge.

Each stage develops the capacity the next stage requires. You cannot track if you are still asleep. You cannot truly see if you have not learned patience. You cannot root into deep time if you have not developed the witness. You cannot speak with real force if you are not grounded. You cannot hack the system if you do not have your own voice to fall back on. And you cannot become the shield for others until you have done all of it.
